Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission to Seth Chandanmal Mutha Aryangla Vaidyak Mahavidyalaya, I.T.I. Road Near by Ram Dhayan Mandir, Gendamal, Satara-415002, Maharashtra (Inst. ID-AYU0155) with an intake capacity of 50 seats (63 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 03 seats in 01 PG courses in the subject namely Kayachikitsa under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26-reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **to Seth Chandanmal Mutha Aryangla Vaidyak Mahavidyalaya, I.T.I. Road Near by Ram Dhayan Mandir, Gendamal, Satara-415002, Maharashtra (Inst. ID-AYU0155)** inspection was conducted on **08.04.2025 and 09.04.2025 on Hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the permission with an intake capacity of 50 seats (63 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 03 seats in 01 PG courses in the subject namely Kayachikitsa under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals Regulations, 2024", MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations thereunder and it was found that none of the faculty of your college were fulfilling the required attendance and same was informed to you vide letter of even no. dated 03.05.2025. In response of the same, you have submitted the clarification vide an email dated 07.05.2025. Further, the clarification with regard to AEBAS and the assessment report was duly placed in 130th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 03.07.2025 and Board decided to once again seek clarification for the AEBAS and same was informed to you vide an email dated 12.07.2025. . In response of the same, you have once again submitted the clarification vide an email dated 15.07.2025
- 3) Accordingly, the assessment report along with the clarification for AEBAS was placed in the 135th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 18.07.2025 On careful examination of the assessment report and the submitted clarification , Board decided to provide an opportunity of hearing to the college and same was communicated to you vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of even no. dated 22.07.2025 to appear on 25.07.2025 before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to why not the permission to your college be denied for the academic session 2025-26
- 4) The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated in the hearing letter. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide letter. No. 571/2025 dated 23.07.2025 against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives Hearing was attended by Dr. Vinod Patange, Principal appeared before the Hearing Committee on 25.07.2025 and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

Respected sir, it brings to your kind notice that, we are continuously working to make AEBAS attendance in regular format. As already mentioned in last letter and clarification Dated on 07/05/2025 it is to be noted that, though we have installed AEBAS machine in the month of March 2025 as per your guidance we were facing difficulties to make attendance from the beginning itself and regarding this we have already informed you dated on 07.05.2025 (attachment No.2) though we have installed AEBAS machine in the month of March 2025 as per your guidance we were facing difficulties to make attendance from the beginning itself and regarding this we have already informed you dated on 07/05/2025(Attachment No-2). Secondly, after that our Institute having summer vacation declared by MUHS Nashik and the vacation period is from.30/04/2025 to 08/06/2025. After vacation period also for some period of time we are unable to do AEBAS attendance due to AEBAS updation process. So, in this regard we have submitted compliance dated on 15/07/2025. (attachment No-3)

It also brings to your kind notice that, our Institute is Government Aided Institute. We are now in the process of recruitment and the interview as per the Government of Maharashtra guidelines we are conducting in the 1st week of August. The approval letter of advertisement approved by Hon. Commissioner, Medical Education Department, Government of Maharashtra attached herewith this Report. (Notarized translated copy attachment No-I). Sir, up to 15 September we are going to fill teaching post of all the department on regular basis as per Director of AYUSH, Government of Maharashtra regulations. Sir, in attendance sent by you, although, it is showing 0% attendance of some of the staff but, among these

hearing done on 25/7/2025 regarding shortcomings of AEBAS attendances it is been observed and heard that teachers were having the technical errors after implementing AEBAS attendance system and which was communicated to NCISM earlier, and as after the institute have implemented AEBAS attendance system in the month of march 2025 and thereafter had MUHS University Summer Vacation to teachers therefore average attendance is showing less.

On the basis of submission of AEBAS proofs or video data to substantiate claims against deficiency/shortcomings as indicated above from the institute.

staff 3 staff is on pregnancy leave, other staff couldn't do attendance due to technical glitches and screen shot with the machine at the time of technical problems has been attached with this letter in compliance report dated on 15/07/2025. This is our humble request to you that as an oldest Government Aided Institute of India give one chance to improve. We will produce CCTV Footage and Medical Leave record of the concerned faculty as per requirement at the time of Online Hearing dated on 25/07/2025 arranged by you. We will definitely make it possible after our recruitment process of state government within 1 or 2 months of time. Kindly give us permission for the academic session of 2025-26 for UG 63 seats including EWS and 3 seats in 1 PG courses in the subject of Kayachikitsa.

- 5) The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms regulations, namely, "Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in the NCISM (MESAR for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024, and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020, the recommendation of Hearing Committee was once again placed in the 137th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 30.07.2025 and Board observed that the college is fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations. Hence, the Board decided to issue yearly permission with an intake capacity of 50 seats (63 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and 03 seats in 01 PG courses in the subject namely Kayachikitsa under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 along with a condition that college shall maintain the attendance of the faculties as per the enforced regulation .

"DECISION"

- 6) Therefore, Yearly permission is hereby granted to Seth Chandanmal Mutha Aryangla Vaidyak Mahavidyalaya, I.T.I. Road Near by Ram Dhayan Mandir, Gendamal, Satara-415002, Maharashtra (Inst. ID-AYU0155) with an intake capacity of 50 seats (63 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course in accordance with Regulation 54 (2) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 and 03 seats in 01 PG courses in the subject namely Kayachikitsa in accordance with Regulation 15 (7) of MESAR PG Ayurveda 2024, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26, subject to the condition that the following requirements shall be fulfilled :-
- I. Minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 50 seats (63 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course and minimum 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 03 seats in 01 PG course shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
- 7) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.

- 8) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 9) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 10) **Compliance of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**
- 11) **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college as per Regulation 55 (2) of MESAR 2024 and the compliance report shall be submitted before 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the process of issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
- All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled,
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024,
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.
 - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
- 12) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
